

Ancient Druids & Their Relics by John Welch

Information from ancient druids is not the same thing as reports by Roman or church historians about druids. A few facts in antique artwork can be seen and the meanings can be speculated by matching similar things. It's very likely that when Celts in Spain had 2 customs which matched British Celts' customs then another Spanish custom was also known in Britain. A Spanish Celtic vase from the 3rd-1st century BC shows horned snakes.[1] England also has a horned snake around a post altar, as in an altar found at Lycia, in Turkey. As these 2 altars are almost identical and the Lycian example is Grecian, then maybe the British one was imported, perhaps in Roman times. But the Gloucestershire horned snake seems genuine.[2] The goddess Brigantia was known in Spain and in Britain.[3] A Celtiberian coin's inscription suggests it means this goddess: "*a coin with Iberian script, BRIGANT_N of a Celtiberian goddess.*" Olmstead, Garret (1994). The Gods of the Celts and Indo-Europeans. Budapest. pp. 354–361. Brigantia in Scotland is holding a globe and has a Medusa emblem which often was a horned snake. She was known from Hungary to Ireland.

Like the pillars on the vase, a 1st century temple in Surrey, which probably had a tree/pillar, is claimed to be tall.[4] "The building itself was 11.5 metres in diameter and was probably more than 10 metres high." The head-dress found at this temple site has a 5 spoked wheel.[5] If we turn in the other direction and look at Vedic tradition we find: "Pandita was a title in Indian Buddhism awarded to scholars who have mastered the five sciences in which a learned person was traditionally supposed to be well-versed. The five

sciences are: science of language, science of logic, science of medicine, science of fine arts and crafts, and science of spirituality." The stipulation can be traced to (but may well predate) the Mahavana, by Maitreya-Natha (ca. 270-350 CE), which states: "Without becoming a scholar in the five sciences, not even the supreme sage can become omniscient. For the sake of refuting and supporting others, and for the sake of knowing everything himself, he makes an effort in these [five sciences]."

If we go back to the Arcobriga vase there is a central figure which may have eyes, it resembles this, the lord of the universe. [6] He lives in a tall tower and is Darubrahman "The Sacred Wood-Riddle", Daruedebata "The wooden god". The diagram shows the black stump god with white eyes within a tower. "Puri Jagannath temple .. has three God/Goddess .. The idols are carved out of Devadaru "divine tree" or Deodar wood". [6]

Another resemblance is a symbolic temple vine in India like the vine on the Arcobriga vase. This article has 28 pages but the main points are copied here: GAUTAMA V. VAJRACHARYA. KIRTIMUKHA, THE SERPENTINE MOTIF, AND GARUDA. p314: "Further, ancient Indians believed that the rain cloud appears like a vine. These literary sources correlate with examples from Indic art, which depict the cloud as kalpalata, the wish-granting vine emerging from makara [crocodile], elephants, or other animals and symbols that can be recognized in rain cloud formations. Usually the Gupta torana [temple gateway], depicted in the sculptural representations of contemporaneous shrines, the rainbow-like arch connecting the twin makaras"

p318: "cloud elephants in the heavenly Ganga that circulates the water between the celestial and terrestrial oceans, represented by two makara [crocodiles] at the end of the mattavarana architrave. The lotus vine is also inhabited by various aquatic and semi-aquatic creatures. A Sanskrit synonym for makara is dhara, literally "rainwater." The water fountains are Skt. dhara-makara, bring many varieties of creatures including cattle to the earth as they descend from heaven at the beginning of the monsoon. All symbolic and decorative elements on the ceiling, including aquatic and semi-aquatic creatures such as fish, water buffaloes and elephants, also appear around the entrances to Indic temples, including the Ajanta cave shrines, because the entrances of Indian shrines and temples represent he atmospheric gate of heaven. Likewise, the door of Orissan temples show water buffaloes and elephants within lotus vines (fig.18)...depicted in the Ajanta ceiling paintings."

p319: "The development of the kirtimukha motif is also affiliated with the age-old Indian belief that the crawling body of a serpent appears in the atmosphere in the form of a monsoon cloud. The Atharvaveda 4.15.5–10 tells us that at the time of drought, when cattle continue to lose body weight, people in India anticipate seeing the monsoon cloud that resembles a giant serpent, gargara. In his sixth-century Brhatsamhita (27.2), V arahamihira states that in the morning or the evening of the Asadha month, if the cloud looks like "a half body of a snake (without head and tail), but showing its crawling abdominal section", one can forecast torrential rain in the near future."

[7] Vajracharya G. Kirtimukha , the serpentine motif and Garuda. Artibus Asiae 2014 Museum Zurich.

The snakes on Arcobriga vase stand near-upright above the roosters on the ground. The Norse tree has a squirrel travelling between an eagle above and a snake below. As the vines curl around the Arcobriga pillars then snakes possibly climb them to the vine of the heavens. Gundestrup cauldron has a divine figure holding a horned snake to his ear, with vines which are next to some but not all the animals and not next to the warriors. Evidently, druids saw a tree as a snake's passage to the gods and snake-oracles gave wisdom.

The church of San Martin of 11th century is about 200km west of where the vase was located. Spanish Celtic forts were used until 5th century when Spain was partly Catholic. The church has pillars, curved arch with central door and a triangle peak which are common designs but they didn't have to be arranged in the same design as the vase.[8] This suggests that the vase pillars were actually built for Druid traditions, with vines and horned snakes as symbols. It's likely that this was a tradition at Surrey temple and other druid sites.


She is the still blue centre of the flame, Or the flash of fire on a red hot blade, She lights the sparkle of the morning dew, Weaves dreams in the early mists.

Here it is!!! Living Treefully – An Inspiring Metaphor for Living and Learning, ready to go out to the world! It was beautifully blessed by Moira and all the Druids who attended Winter Solstice. Thank you one and all.

Living Treefully is for any person, organisation, group, team or relationship that has ever asked the question, 'Where next?' – a system for managing change and 'living treefully' in the seasonal way that trees do.

It can help to guide you and provide insight, no matter where you are in the journey of your life right now. When you are starting a new endeavour, just like the tree you will begin in Winter with planting the seed of what it is you wish to harvest. Alternatively, when you are stuck in a rut, instead of trying to jump to a solution you can take a moment to ask where you are in the cycle of the seasons at this moment. Winter/Seeding? Spring/Emergence? Summer/Maturation? Autumn/Manifestation?

WINTER - the time of SEEDING, of Potential and Possibility, of Beginnings. The SEED beneath the winter soil is excited by the spark of life, promising what is to come. Our projects need to start with intuition, idea, potential, the big picture

SPRING - The time of EMERGENCE. The tiny plant pokes two little green leaves ABOVE THE SOIL and its growth is nurtured by the warming Spring rain. Our vulnerable ideas need nurturing in order to discover their potential and grow stronger.

SUMMER - The time of MATURATION. Under the harsh glare of the summer sun, the plant's abundant spring growth requires some DISCIPLINE and STRUCTURE, branches are pruned, laterals are pinched out or a supporting trellis is erected, to ensure the best possible harvest (outcome). When it is ready, our project must be given structure and subjected to intellectual rigour to make sure it can mature to a successful harvest.

AUTUMN - The time of MANIFESTATION. A time of completion, of HARVEST. If we have followed the cycle well, our project will reach completion. A time of satisfaction and reflection.

And the cycle goes on - we can choose DECAY or GENESIS - an ending or the planting of a new Seed.

The Wheel of Segais – Living Treefully describes this seasonal cycle as a vitally important process and an invaluable tool that you can start using any time. Journey around The Wheel of Segais, delve into the wisdom pool and the quadrants of the four seasons. See how others have benefitted from 'living treefully' in the personal stories told throughout the book and try out the exercises offered at the end of each segment.




Book Review - Sacred Actions by Dana O'Driscoll By Mandy Gibson

As someone who has enjoyed Dana O'Driscoll's blog, The Druid's Garden, for several years now I was excited to be approached to review her new book, *Sacred Actions: Living the Wheel of the Year through Earth-Centred Sustainable Practices.* Her approaches to everything from daily practice to permaculture, from healing the land to creation of personal sacred tools, are so incredibly detailed, meticulously considered and thoroughly explained. This book is no exception, and clearly a labour of love. It's laid out in the eightfold year that we're all familiar with, and certainly there are aspects that are aligned with Northern Hemisphere practice. But what greets you as you dig into each section is a whole year of personal and external practice that could easily be applied in our region as well - the internal work and ways of looking at the world that she presents are universal.

What's even more engaging is the encouragement to embrace all that we do as sacred, to turn it in to a truly daily practice which combines self-sufficiency with self-care and relationship with the wider world. She gives detailed how-tos for each season and concept, framed around a lovely set of triads, and uses her own stories as both examples and templates. My own deep work with history and family at this point in my life resonated deeply with her story of her Grandmother and explanations of the power of heritage in the Imbolc section, and although the book consciously begins with the Winter Solstice I feel a reader could (after reading the whole thing first of course!) jump in wherever they are in the year and gain benefit from it.

Sacred Actions: Living the Wheel of the Year through Earth-Centred Sustainable Practices is available from Amazon and Book Depository.

- Communication with Southern Hemisphere OBOD community members, including answering messages and emails generated by the above platforms, and ensuring the release of SerpentStar is advertised across various online OBOD communities.

- Providing support to Assembly host teams with booking forms etc hosted on Druidry Australia.



Needless to say, you must be a member of OBOD currently living in the Southern Hemisphere (ie able to contribute to SerpentStar per the current guidelines) to serve as Editor, but you could be a Bard, Ovate, or Druid.

The ideal persom will also benefit from the following (trust me on this):

- Intermediate to advanced skills in the Wordpress platform

- Experience in magazine publication, particularly in an online format

- Strong written communication - editing and proofreading skills or training will really help

- Skills necessary to lay out and edit a magazine to be distributed in printable pdf format

- A reliable computer with appropriate layout/design software, plenty of storage and a strong internet connection. I currently lay out in iStudio on a Mac, so someone with the same setup could be provided with the current template

- Familiarity with running a Facebook page and YouTube channel (or the ability to self-train) will really help

- A long enough time as an active member of the local OBOD community to know heaps of people, and have attended a few different types of event, is something I found very helpful when starting out

No need to write a long letter - so long as you've read, and are comfortable with, the information above then a few dot points would be plenty. For your application to be considered however you must mention the phrase "brown M&Ms" - I will explain that bit of fun when the new Editor is announced. 

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

Anam Cara Soul Space Readings, Tarot, Astrology, and Sacred Plant Essences with Fleur Grant



Greetings and Kia ora, my name is Fleur Grant and I am a student of OBOD and a practicising tarot reader, astrologer, and sacred plant essence practitioner.

My connection to Spirit has been active for as long as I can remember. I have always been blessed to receive messages, and this ability has been passed down my family line from my Anglo-Irish grandmother, who possessed second sight. I have good reason to believe my Irish ancestors, who left Ireland after one of the large famines, were descended from ancient Druids.

The land of my birth, Aotearoa New Zealand, has provided me with a deep appreciation of the native forest here, and my communion with nature has been further developed through training as a plant essence practitioner. Plant essences contain specific healing properties that shift emotional and traumatic patterns. There are even essences that can shift DNA patterns that have travelled down family lines. This is an exciting area of work, as it ties into the scientific discovery of epigenetics, which is confirming what ancient cultures have always known, that trauma can be hereditary. For instance, there may be a pattern of betrayal and heartbreak in relationships that have travelled down the ancestral bloodline. As Druids, we work with our ancestral inheritance, and it is now possible for us to clear negative hereditary patterns and receive our divine inheritance.

Astrology is an ancient tool which allows us to map the potential of a soul and look at key strengths and challenges. Most people are familiar with Sun Signs, but you are more than just your star-sign! Based on your time, date and place of birth, natal astrology explains the map of the Zodiac for your individual birth, and the position and relationship of all the planets and signs that make up your personality and potential. I also provide updates of full moon and other major astrological patterns for New Zealand and Australia on my Facebook page.

Tarot (I use Rider Waite and the Druidic Tarot) is an amazing tool for Divination. Tarot is my first port of call for questions about relationship insight and decisions.

Anam Cara is an old Gaelic term which means 'soul friend'. Here, at Anam Cara, I work with you in integrity, openness and non-judgement, using the ancient tools of tarot, astrology and sacred plant essences to help you make decisions, clear emotional and hereditary blocks, and move forward with confidence.



Marriage and Civil Unions are the only ceremonies that require a legal, registered Celebrant. However, I also craft and perform many other rms of ceremony and blessing:





Although we would think of **Imbolc** as being in the midst of Winter, it represents in fact the first of a trio of Spring celebrations, since it is the time of the first appearance of the snowdrop, and of the melting of the snows and the clearing of the debris of Winter. It is a time when we sense the first glimmer of Spring, and when the lambs are born. In the Druid tradition it is a gentle, beautiful festival in which the Mother Goddess is honoured with eight candles rising out of the water at the centre of the ceremonial circle.

The Goddess that ruled Samhuinn was the Cailleach, the Grey Hag, the Mountain Mother, the Dark Woman of Knowledge. But by Imbolc the Goddess has become Brighid, the Goddess of poets, healers and midwives.

And so we often use Imbolc as a time for an Eisteddfod dedicated to poetry and song praising the Goddess in her many forms. The Christian development of this festival is Candlemas – the time of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple. For years successive Popes had tried to stop parades of lit candles in the streets of Rome at this time, until seeing that it was impossible to put a stop to this pagan custom, they suggested that everyone enter the churches so that the priests could bless the candles.
